

# Broken, Healed by God's Love, and More Beautiful Than Before



This year our annual retreat was directed by Father Philip Chircop, S.J. The retreat started on Sunday August 18<sup>th</sup> and ended on August 23<sup>rd</sup>. The theme that ran through all the conferences was, "Perfectly Imperfect." As Father developed the theme we found it to be very much in harmony with our Resurrection charism and belief in God's unconditional love

for us. God's love is so deep and passionate for each of us, that He does everything He can to reassure us of His love and help heal our brokenness.

Father Philip told us about a beautiful Japanese tradition and art called Kintsugi which teaches us the awesome truth about our brokenness and the careful and loving healing hands of our God and heavenly potter.

What is Kintsugi? The word Kintsugi means "join with gold." It is a Japanese art in which broken pottery is repaired with gold. This repair renders a new piece which is actually more resilient and more exquisite than the original unbroken piece.

In our world so often the imperfect or broken are thrown away or hidden out of sight. But our God treasures and reverences each human person, each human heart and soul so much that no matter how broken we are He never throws us away. Isaiah 42:3 says, *A bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick, he will not quench.* And in Psalm 34:18 we are told, *The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.* 

Instead of mending our brokenness with gold, our God heals us with the blood of Christ, His Son. In 2Corinthians 4:7 we read: *But we hold this treasure in earthen vessels, that the surpassing power may be of God and not from us.* The repaired vessel becomes more valuable because; *It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me*, Galatians 2:20.

## Tribute to Sr. Mary Dominic Russell, C.R.

Sr. Mary Dominic was born June 16, 1934 to Joseph Russell and Marie Silkowski. She had one younger sister.

She entered the Resurrection Sisters on August 2, 1952 and professed her first vows on August 15, 1954. After her first profession Sr. Dominic was stationed at the House of Studies in Harrison, New York and attended and graduated from Fordham University.

From 1957 to 1969 Sr. Dominic taught grades 4 through 8 at St. Mary of the Angels, St. Bede, and St. Casimir. From 1969 to 1990 she taught at St. Casimir High School.

In 1991 Sr. Dominic began her studies in Pastoral Ministry. Upon the completion of studies and achieving her certification as a chaplain, Sister served as a chaplain at Westlake Community Hospital and Resurrection Medical Center.

Today, Sr. Dominic continues to serve at Ascension Living Resurrection Village as a lector, as a reader of the newsletter over the inhouse television, and she serves on the Residents' Menu Advisory Committee.

Sr. Dominic loves people and is a source of inspiration and comfort to many. She values community life and does all she can to support her Sisters.

### Tribute to Sr. Virginia Ann

Sr. Virginia Ann was born March 10, 1944 to Frank Wanzek and Colette Yokiel in Albert Lee, Minnesota. She has four siblings, two sisters and two brothers.

She entered the Resurrection Sisters after high school on August 22, 1962. Sr. Virginia Ann professed her first vows on August 15, 1964. After her first profession Sr. Virginia was stationed at the House of Studies in Harrison, New York and attended Fordham University.

From 1965 to 1966 Sr. Virginia Ann taught 5<sup>th</sup> grade at St. Casimir.

In 1969 she received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Medical Records from St. Louis University and became the Supervisor of Medical Records from 1969 to 1974. She went to Notre Dame University for several summers to earn a master's degree in Not-for-Profit Finance.

Most of Sr. Virginia Ann's life as a Sister of the Resurrection has been a gift of service to her Sisters and the Congregation. She served as Directress of Novices and Junior Professed, Provincial Treasurer, General Councilor and General Treasurer in Rome, Treasurer in the Chicago Province, a Local Superior, and a total of 23 years as Provincial Superior in the Immaculate Conception Province.

Sr. Virginia Ann is a faith-filled religious who trusts deeply in God's presence and grace.
